Book: Wonder Author: R.I. Palacio Genre: Fiction What it's about: A boy called August who is born with a facial deformity and it's about how other people of all ages treat him. Why it is good: It has different points of view from all of the people that he encounters, so the reader can understand how his friends and relatives feel about August.

Book: The Illustrated Mum Author: Jacqueline Wilson Genre: Fiction What it's about: It is from the point of view of a ten year old girl called Dolphin and she talks about her extraordinary mum called Marigold. Marigold is not like any ordinary mum: she has a love for tattoos; she has a drinking problem and can sometimes act different ly to everyone else. Dolphin loves Marigold and thinks that she is unique and wonderful. However, Star, who is Dolphin's sister, is embarrassed by Marigold's tattoos and behaviour.
