Spring I!



We hope you have all had a wonderful Christmas holiday and enjoyed the time with your families. This half term is one of our favourites! Our topic focus is 'Amazing Planet'. For the first 3 weeks, the children have had the opportunity to explore and learn all about rainforests. Over the next 3 weeks,

we will be learning all about jungles! This includes learning about the different types of plants, animals, and tribes within these environments. I am sure the children have been looking forward to sharing their new learning with you.



The children have made fantastic progress with their letter formation this term. Some children have been working hard to learn how to write their surnames, along with their first names. In Literacy, we are now focusing on writing captions and short sentences. The children are learning all about adding their magic 5 within their writing.

Magic 5: capital letters, finger spaces, full stops, legible handwriting and asking – does it make sense?

As always, we appreciate any support you can offer your child with their writing at home.

Phonics

Our RWI phonics sessions continue to remain high priority in Reception, and they are really helping the children to learn to blend and segment, whilst also learning to recognise and read their 'special friends' within words. We will continue to send QR codes home weekly in their learning log so that the children can continue this learning at home.

<u>Maths</u>

This half term we have being continuing to understand and use numbers to 10. The children have been learning to compare amounts by using the terms 'fewer' and 'greater'. We have also recapped the partwhole model to support your child in learning their number bonds to 10.



'Read With Me' sessions

We would like the opportunity to thank all of the grown-ups who attended our, 'Read With Me' sessions. These afternoon sessions are a great opportunity for you to not only share the love of reading with your child, but to also encourage language development and build their imagination. After listening to your feedback, the reading sessions will now start at 2:45pm every Wednesday for **both** classes.

<u>Diploma</u>

Our Diploma focus for Spring I is 'Wildlife'. The children are to complete 6 RSPB challenges that will teach them all about different ways to look after our environment and the creatures in it. Stay tuned - we will be sharing our completed challenges on Twitter!
