


Dear parent/carers,

We have some exciting news - you can now join in with your child's phonics lessons at home!
At the end of each week, a new link will appear on your child's Google Classroom.
The video will be of the sounds they have been learning that week, so it's a great opportunity to recap and support your child's reading.

To login to Google Classroom:

1. Type 'Google Classroom' into Google.
2. Type in the G Suite login here (found in the front of the planner). Then, click next.
