We hope you have all had a wonderful Christmas holiday and enjoyed the time with your families. This half term is one of our favourite ones as our topic focus is 'Amazing Planet'. The children have had the opportunity to explore and learn all about rainforests. This includes learning about the different types of plants, animals, and tribes within these environments. I am sure the children have been looking forward to sharing their new learning with you.

Writing

The children have made fantastic progress with their letter formation this term. The children have been working hard to learn how to write their surnames, along with their first names. In Literacy, we are now focusing on writing captions and short sentences. The children are learning all about adding their magic 5 within their writing!

Phonics

Our RWI phonics sessions continue to remain high priority in Reception, and they are really helping the children to learn to blend and segment, whilst also learning to recognise and read their 'special friends' within words. We will continue to send QR codes home weekly in their learning log so that the children can continue this learning at home.

Maths

This half term we have been learning all about comparing weight and height. Over the next couple of weeks, we will be continuing to understand and use numbers to 10 to support the children learning their number bonds to 10 using tens frames and part whole models.

RSPB Old Moor School Trip

Next half term our topic is "All Things Bright and Beautiful". As part of this we will be going to RSPB Old Moor on a school trip on **Wednesday 6th March 2024** to explore pond dipping, minibeasts and their habitats.

You will have all received an email with a link to a google form, please can we ask that you complete the google form to consent for your child to attend and pay a contribution of £15.42 on parent pay by **Wednesday 7th February 2024**. It is important for us to stress that in the event of an inadequate number of parental contributions it will not be possible for this valuable trip to take place and it will be cancelled.

Our Diploma focus for Spring I is 'Wildlife'. We were lucky to have a visit from 'Prickly Edge' Hedgehog rescue who showed us how to care for a hedgehog and how to keep them safe.
