If they don't pass the quiz they have to read the book again and then re-take the quiz.




Children can bring in books from home to quiz on too!



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




Arithmetic

- The key stage 1 test will consist of two test parts
- Paper 1: this paper combines texts and questions. This will also include a list of useful words and some practice questions
- Paper 2: the reading booklet and answer booklet are separate in this paper. Both reading papers will contain a mixture of fiction and non-fiction texts
- Each paper is worth 50 per cent of the marks which will be converted into the scaled score of 100

All around the world, children play all sorts of different games. You don't need expensive games or lots of space to play a great game, just some imagination!

Play can be inside or outside, and you can play on your own or with lots of friends. Some games are calm and quiet, whilst others are very noisy! Some games like football, chess and jigsaw puzzles are popular in lots of countries so they have the same rules and equipment wherever they are played. But some games are only well known in certain countries.

Here are five games that children in different countries like to play:



Pilolo – from Ghana

Pilolo is a hiding game using sticks, stones, coins or other small items. One child hides the objects. It's then a race for all the other players to find one of the hidden items and get back to the finish line first. You need quick eyes and quick feet for this game! Paper 2 is the more challenging paper. The children have a separate reading booklet and answer booklet. They will need to use different reading skills to answer the question.


