We hope that you all had a lovely restful half term and the children are ready to blow us away with their progress.

# Spring 2!



This half term our topic is 'All Things Bright and Beautiful.' As part of this we will be looking at the lifecycles of animals, plants, humans and changes over time. In our project we will be exploring different painting techniques and creating textures to create a garden landscape.

As part of our topic we are going on a trip to **RSPB**Old Moor on Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> March 2023. The children will have the opportunities to put all their learning from this half term into practise by becoming plant detectives and look at a variety of minibeast habitats.

# **Writing**

The children made fantastic progress with their writing skills last half term, using their magic 5 within their writing and becoming increasingly independent writers. In Literacy, we focused on innovating characters and the ending of a story writing short sentences about these. This half term we will be continuing to increase children's independence to write short sentences in speech bubbles and to continue a rhyming string. As always, we appreciate any support you can offer your child with their writing at home.

#### **Phonics**



Our RWI phonics sessions continue to remain high priority in Reception, and they are really helping the children to learn to blend and segment, whilst also learning to recognise and read their 'special friends' within words. We will continue to send QR codes home weekly in their learning log so that the children can continue this learning at home.

# **Maths**



This half term we will be continuing to understand and use numbers to 10, including building our number bond knowledge using ten frames and part whole models to support this, adding and subtracting numbers within 10 and creating simple and complexed patterns.
