Can we start with saying that we hope you all had a lovely Christmas break and we are so happy to see everybody back in the academy. The children have come back to school with excitement and enthusiasm! This month, we have been busy reading, 'Monkey Puzzle' and the children have enjoyed learning how to retell the story using Makaton actions. Our new topic is called, 'Amazing Planet' and this covers lots of different areas of the EYFS curriculum. The children have been building 3D dens, weaving, writing funny captions and learning new words such as 'humorous' and 'tropical'.

During our 'Time To...' sessions we have been learning about different breathing techniques, how to relax our bodies and how this can have a positive impact on our mood and mental health.

We have also been learning about recycling and how to re-use plastic. It has been wonderful to see how you all recycle at home. Keep those tweets coming!

Our RWI phonics sessions are really helping all the children to learn to read and write. The children have loved learning their new sounds and we will continue to blend and segment to develop our reading and writing. Please continue to practice these skills at home!

Read Write Inc

In Maths, we have been comparing groups within 10 and using language such as, 'more than' and, 'fewer than'. To support learning at home, we have provided logins in your child's learning log. One is for Google Classroom and one is for School Jam (Maths specific). Your class teacher will let you know when you need to access these.

Next Half Term



Our new topic is called, 'All Things Bright and Beautiful' It covers lots of different areas of the EYFS curriculum. Above, you will see our main focus for next half term. We are very excited to teach the children all about the natural world, plants, animals and lifecycles.

Power Maths

In our maths sessions, we will be focusing on addition to 10 and combining two groups to find the whole. At home, you can support your child by encouraging careful counting of real objects and knowing the total of groups of objects and number bonds to 10. Please note: you will see our 'Number of the Week' cover previous numbers as we are consolidating learning.
