March—Read with another class.

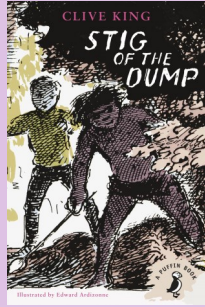
April—Comfy read!
