This Month in Reception!

We have had a wonderful month in Reception. We are so proud with how well the children have progressed in their phonics and number, the children are just brilliant! A big thank you from all of us in Reception for making our first half term as successful as it has been. It has been a big adjustment for many children (and probably some parents and carers), and we appreciate the support you have given this half term.

This month we have been so busy reading 'On the Journey Home from Grandpa's 'Owl Babies' and 'Room on the Broom' to help us write captions and labels.

Our RWI phonics sessions are really helping the children to learn to read and write. The children have loved learning their new sounds.

In Maths, we have been learning numbers to 5. We have also looked at sorting objects into more than two groups. We loved sorting the Autumn leaves into different categories! Finally, we looked at 2D and 3D shapes.

Phonics



Phonics and early reading remain high priority in reception and all children will attend phonics lessons daily, with additional sessions for some. As you may have seen at home, our children join in with these lessons enthusiastically and would love the opportunity to show off their developing knowledge at home. We will continue to send home QR codes, so the children can continue practising at home.

Next half term, we will be continuing with understanding better numbers to 10 (including counting and recognising numbers to 10 as well as finding number bonds to 5). At school, we provide many opportunities for children to practise these skills through games and fun activities. These can be replicated at home so any additional activities you do at home are very welcome.

Writing



Every morning (and throughout the day), our children are working hard to write their names. They are making amazing progress with their letter formation and many are able to form letters correctly. This activity will continue most mornings so please encourage your child to write their name at home.

Next half term our PE sessions will continue to be on Mondays for both RC and RSJ. Please ensure the children arrive in the correct PE kit and bring their school uniform in a bag.

Wider Curriculum

Please make sure you check your child's book bag daily and return any books on a Thursday.
